

University as an incitement to violate the ethics of scientific publications

Since universities, having become massive, ceased to produce elites, and turned into a convenient tool to control the adult population, they have lost orientation towards scientific values. Conveyor production of "scientists", reorientation to market rails and placing a bet on managerialism, led to the normalization of the phenomena inherent in the business environment: fierce competition and fraud.

In Russia, this situation is aggravated by the fact that the resource allocation system (grants and allowances) is not protected from fraud (frankly speaking, in every case when you violate ethics, you are paid extra for it); and "negative selection" - the more significant the position of the individual in terms of influence on society, the lower the requirements for his scientific reputation.
